Waste Management Policy

To reduce waste at Institute, students and staffs are educated on proper waste management practices through lecture, advertisement on notice board, work shop, displaying slogans board in the campus. Waste is collected on a daily basis from various parts and is separated as dry and wet waste of the college. The Institute is conscious of its responsibility towards society and environment and ensure that all the waste is used & disposed responsibly.

Institute encourages environment friendly practices as follows

A. Solid waste management:

- To reduce waste in institute students and staffs are educated on proper waste management practices.
- Waste is collected on a daily basis from various sources and is separated as dry and wet waste.
- Colour coded dustbins are used for different types of wastes green for wet and blue for solid waste.
- Daily garbage is collected by housekeeping personnel, further segregation is done and kept at one designated place. Later, gram panchayat personnel collect for further processing. All waste water lines from toilet, bathrooms etc. are connected with pipes and goes to soak pit (soakta), waste materials like plastic, paper are collected and sold to scrap vendors.
- Efforts have been to taken to produce compost manure from solid waste.

B. Hierarchical approach of waste by Reducing, Reusing & Recycling.

- Reduce volume of waste prior to disposal
- Reuse in the current forms the materials recovered from the waste stream
- Recycle compost or recover materials for use as direct or indirect inputs to new products.
